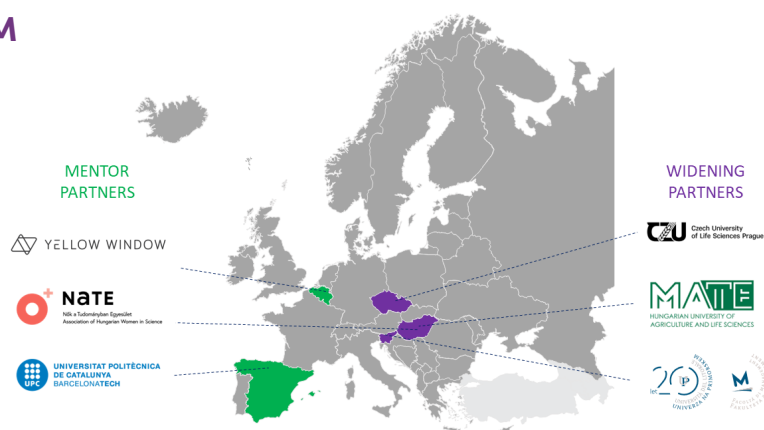

GENDER EQUALITY IN HIGHER EDUCATION AND RESEARCH: THE STEM FIELD AND THE AGRICULTURE

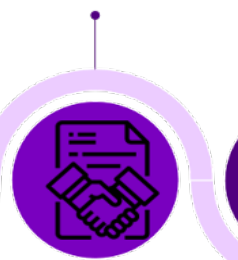
The Needs

Gender inequality is a major barrier in the R&I area that limits the capabilities and capacities of research and education institutions. Across the EU, the development of Gender Equality Plans (GEP) intends to address the problems at Research Performing Organisations (RPOs); however, the variability in capability, capacity, and expertise hinders the efficient implementation of the institutional GEPs, especially in the widening countries. Additionally, there are specific GE issues within certain fields of study at research and education institutions. In this context, GE issues in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) fields are well-known, and specific action plans have been developed. Within STEM, agriculture and life-science-focused RPOs face very similar problems, but they lack sector-specific measures and mitigation plans. Furthermore, in agriculture, a large GE sector-specific imbalance exists in developing countries where a relevant proportion of RPOs' international students come from. The AGRIGEP project, with the joint efforts of six consortium partners, aims to i) perform a responsible assessment of widening RPOs' current status on GEP implementation, ii) improve capabilities through intensive capacity building, and iii) develop and implement an agriculture and life-science targeted GEP with sectorial specific measures and strategies. These results could lead to long-term institutional reforms. Additionally, this project will work to establish the inclusion of GE issues within the RPOs' educational system and the professional training of students. The realisation of these objectives and the implementation of inclusive GEPs will enhance the inclusiveness, reputation, attractiveness, and research excellence of widening country RPOs. Moreover, it will promote the transformation of institutions and advance GE within the ERA as well.

In 2018, women represented 32.8% of the total population of researchers at the European level ⁽¹⁾



Women are under-represented at the highest level in research. They transition to Principal Investigators at a 20% lower rate than men ⁽¹⁾



In 2019, 11.1% of women researchers in the EU worked part-time and under precarious working contracts compared to 7.2% of men researchers ⁽¹⁾

UPC - Universitat Politècnica de Catalunya BarcelonaTech

UPC is a public institution of research and higher education in the fields of engineering, architecture, sciences and technology. The university offers more than 66 diploma and degree courses, 81 MSc courses and 45 PhD Programmes among its 9 campuses. Every year, UPC hosts more than 6,000 bachelor's and master's students and more than 500 doctoral students (academic year 2018-2019) with a high graduate employment rate: 93% of its graduates are employed. The UPC has a specialised unit that is dedicated to the contractual, legal, and financial aspects of European Research projects called the International Projects Unit (UPI). Under the Horizon 2020 programme (2014-2020), the UPC was granted 243 projects, of which it has coordinated 66 (13 of them are funded by the European Research Council). The UPC also has 53 projects (of which it coordinates 9) funded by other European programmes. Regarding the current Horizon Europe Programme, UPC has been awarded 13 projects, significantly, 2 as a coordinator and 2 ERC Starting Grants, with a total funding of 9.76 million. Since 2013 the UPC has endorsed the European Commission's European Charter and Code for Researchers, two documents, addressed to researchers as well as research employers and funders in both the public and private sectors, are key elements in the EU's policy to boost researchers' careers. Moreover, in the context of the Human Resources Strategy for Researchers (HRS4R), which supports the Charter, the UPC obtained (in July 2017) an official acknowledgment for HR Excellence in Research and was granted the certified logo of the program by the European Commission. With reference to the GE Policy, UPC is currently working on the implementation of its Fourth Gender Equal Opportunities Plan (2022-2026) through the Equal Opportunities Office, which was created in 2007. From 2017 to 2021 the UPC was involved in the GEECCO project (Gender Equality in Engineering through Communication and Commitment), which aimed to reduce gender inequality in European research institutions working in STEM fields.

CZU - Czech University of Life Sciences



CZU is a leading educational and research centre in the Czech Republic. It encompasses more than one hundred years of tradition with the newest technologies, progressive science, and research activities in agriculture, forestry, bioeconomy and biotechnologies, landscape architecture, environment, food, wood sciences, economics and business, management, ICT, rural development, mechanical engineering, and pedagogy. CZU offers 296 accredited study programmes at BSc, MSc and PhD levels taught in Czech and 154 taught in English. The University is a member of the EuroLeague for Life Sciences (ELLS), Union of Forest Research Organisations (IUFRO), Interuniversity Consortium for Agricultural and Related Sciences in Europe (ICA), Conference of Deans and Directors of European Forestry Faculties and Schools (ConDDFFES) and many other alliances. Under the Horizon 2020 programme, CZU was granted 18 projects (2 as a coordinator). Up to now, CZU has been awarded 25 projects from the Horizon Europe programme, 4 as coordinator, 1 ERC Consolidator grants and 1 MSCA. In 2021, CZU was awarded the HR Excellence in Research (HR Award) by the European Commission. The CZU adheres to the rules set out in the Charter and the Code in the area of recruitment and employment of their staff. CZU also adopted the GEP in 2021 which expresses the CZU commitment to address gender mainstreaming and equal gender opportunities in a systematic and long-term manner, which was published on its website. Transparent and equal access to employees is one of the important elements of strategic human resources management which is covered by CZU's 2021+ Strategic Plan for Educational, Creative and Other Activities, where GE is one of the specific objectives. In addition to participating in the project as a mentored partner, CZU is responsible for the communication and dissemination activities of the project as WP2 leader.

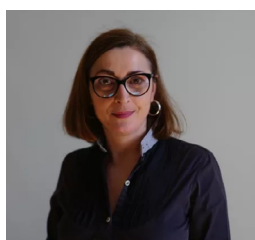

Dr. Marcela Linková, who is the head of the Centre for Gender and Science at the Institute of Sociology of the Czech Academy of Sciences. She holds a doctorate in sociology from Charles University in Prague. Her research focuses on gender and research, specifically on the sociology of gendered organisations and institutional change, gender-based violence in academia, governance of research, and public policies for gender equality in R&I. She is the Member State Co-Chair of the ERA Forum subgroup on inclusive gender equality.



Dr. Beáta Nagy, who is a professor of sociology at the Corvinus University of Budapest, President of the Hungarian Sociological Association and director of the Centre for Gender and Culture at Corvinus. Her previous research dealt with work-life balance, gender and executive search, women's advancement in academic life, and intensive motherhood during the pandemic.

Girls' Day at MATE, Hungary 27/04/2023

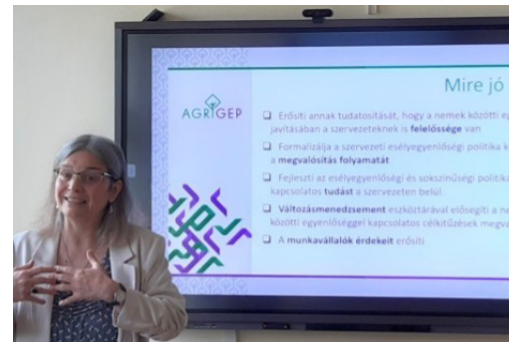

Awareness raising event at MATE, Hungary 24/05/2023

Participants were able to learn about the experiences of women researchers in STEM fields through a diverse program. 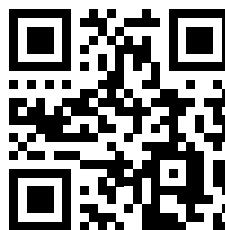
